## Communities Against Terrorism Potential Indicators of Terrorist Activity Related to Internet Café

What Should I Consider Suspicious?	Why?
<p><b>People Who:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Are overly concerned about privacy, attempts to shield the screen from view of others</li> <li>• Always pay cash or use credit card(s) in different name(s)</li> <li>• Apparently use tradecraft: lookout, blocker or someone to distract employees</li> <li>• Act nervous or suspicious behavior inconsistent with activities</li> <li>• Are observed switching SIM cards in cell phone or use of multiple cell phones</li> <li>• Travel illogical distance to use Internet Café</li> </ul> <p><b>Activities on Computer indicate:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Evidence of a residential based internet provider (signs on to Comcast, AOL, etc.)</li> <li>• <b>Use of anonymizers, portals, or other means to shield IP address</b></li> <li>• Suspicious or coded writings, use of code word sheets, cryptic ledgers, etc.</li> <li>• Encryption or use of software to hide encrypted data in digital photos, etc.</li> <li>• Suspicious communications using VOIP or communicating through a PC game</li> </ul> <p><b>Use Computers to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Download content of extreme/radical nature with violent themes</b></li> <li>• Gather information about vulnerable infrastructure or obtain photos, maps or diagrams of transportation, sporting venues, or populated locations</li> <li>• Purchase chemicals, acids, hydrogen peroxide, acetone, fertilizer, etc.</li> <li>• Download or transfer files with "how-to" content such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Content of extreme/radical nature with violent themes</li> <li>- Anarchist Cookbook, explosives or weapons information</li> <li>- Military tactics, equipment manuals, chemical or biological information</li> <li>- <b>Terrorist/revolutionary literature</b></li> <li>- Preoccupation with press coverage of terrorist attacks</li> <li>- Defensive tactics, police or government information</li> <li>- Information about timers, electronics, or remote transmitters / receivers</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<p><b>Be part of</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Gather information without identifying themselves</li> <li>✓ Identify and describe suspicious people</li> <li>✓ Do not search for individual information</li> <li>✓ Do not use online communication</li> <li>✓ If someone is in law enforcement</li> </ul> <p><b>Do not jeopardize safety of</b></p> <p>Preventing terrorism by learning positive counterterrorism. community essential to efforts.</p> <p>Some of this could be in law enforcement context to investigate and handout an</p>
