PARIS, France, Sept. 1 (AP)—The French cabinet met today and decided French Ambassador Paul Gonsky informed that "the French troops stationed at Poland, this morning."

The agency also reported that the Polish Embassy here had announced that "Germany violated the Polish frontier at this point."

BERLIN, Poland, Sept. 1 (AP)—The German press today reported that Hitler had issued a proclamation in which he accused the Warsaw government of appealing to arms and called for the army to march into Poland and bring the country under the control of the Reich.
